The Joseph Smith Translation renders this passage 'or be troubled by letter, except ye receive it from us.' Perhaps a forgery was circulating that reinforced the misunderstanding. In any case it is important that teachings or instructions come from those with proper authority." (Robert L. Millet, ed., Studies in Scripture, Vol. 6: Acts to Revelation [Salt Lake City: Deseret Book Co., 1987], 160.)</p> <p>The church, as you know, is big on authority. Who says it is more important than what they actually say. It sounds to me like there was a miscommunication which caused needless speculation about when the second coming of Christ would come.</p>

<p>Joseph Smith:</p> <p>"Paul in his second epistle to the Thessalonians gives utterance to a prophecy which covers the whole ground of the absolute and universal apostasy of Christendom. A prophecy which, if the apostasy of so-called Christendom has not been complete and universal, proves beyond all question that the great Apostle of the Gentiles is a false prophet; or if fulfilled, then it proves that the Church of Christ, so far as it existed in the earth was to be destroyed; that another and different religion was to be substituted for the Christian religion: that another church, one founded by men, was to take the place of the Church of Christ, a worldly church dominated by the very spirit of Lucifer, who, under its rule, would oppose and exalt himself above all that is called God; and sit in the temple of God showing himself, so far as this world is concerned, that he is God. Moreover Paul declared in this very</p>	

prophecy I am about to quote that the forces which would ultimately bring to pass this universal apostasy from the Christian religion-'the mystery of iniquity'-was already at work even in his day." (History of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, 1:xcii.)

D&C 123:7 It is an imperative duty that we owe to God, to angels, with whom we shall be brought to stand, and also to ourselves, to our wives and children, who have been made to bow down with grief, sorrow, and care, under the most damning hand of murder, tyranny, and oppression, supported and urged on and upheld by the influence of that spirit which hath so strongly riveted the creeds of the fathers, who have inherited lies, upon the hearts of the children, and filled the world with confusion, and has been growing stronger and stronger, and is now the very mainspring of all corruption, and the whole earth groans under the weight of its iniquity.

The great apostasy was more than just a loss of keys or priesthood power because if it were, and if the Catholic church with its assertion that it possessed the keys and the priesthood could lose them, then so could the Mormon church with its assertion that it possesses the keys and the priesthood. In fact, D&C 121 states that no matter who holds Priesthood, they lose it if they misuse their authority.

D&C 121:37 That they may be conferred upon us, it is true; but when we undertake to cover our sins, or to gratify our pride, our vain ambition, or to exercise control or dominion or compulsion upon the souls of the children of men, in any degree of unrighteousness, behold, the heavens withdraw themselves; the Spirit of the Lord is grieved; and when it is withdrawn, Amen to the priesthood or the authority of that man.

Here's how apostasy happens:

Apostasy does not require the wholesale abandonment of truth. Instead, it merely requires slow, small corruptions to the truths delivered through a dispensation head. "Apostasy never came by renouncing the gospel, but always by corrupting it." (Hugh Nibley, *Temples and Cosmos*, pg. 395.)

II Thes 2:4 Who opposeth and exalteth himself above all that is called God, or that is worshipped; so that he as God sitteth in the temple of God, showing himself that he is God.	Who opposes and exalts himself so proudly and insolently against and over all that is called God or that is worshiped, [even to his actually] taking his seat in the temple of God, proclaiming that he himself is God. (AMP)
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Church leaders back then and even now claim to speak the word of God as if they were God, and to claim that God has given his power to men, as if they had the power of God.

2 Nephi 28:5 And they deny the power of God, the Holy One of Israel; and they say unto the people: Hearken unto us, and hear ye our precept; for behold there is no God today, for the Lord and the Redeemer hath done his work, and he hath given his power unto men;

2 Nephi 28:6 Behold, hearken ye unto my precept; if they shall say there is a miracle wrought by the hand of the Lord, believe it not; for this day he is not a God of miracles; he hath done his work.

II Thes 2:5 Remember ye not, that, when I was yet with you, I told you these things?	Do you not recollect that when I was still with you, I told you these things? (AMP)
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Paul reminds them that he taught them about the coming apostasy, but apparently, they overlooked that teaching and got caught up in the more glamorous teaching about the second coming.

II Thes 2:6 And now ye know what withholdeth that he might be revealed in his time.	And now you know what is restraining him [from being revealed at this time]; it is so that he may be manifested (revealed) in his own [appointed] time. (AMP)
II Thes 2:7 For the mystery of iniquity doth already work: only he who now letteth [The archaic meaning this word it to restrain.] [will let], until he be taken out of the way.	For the mystery of lawlessness (that hidden principle of rebellion against constituted authority) is already at work in the world, [but it is] restrained only until he who restrains is taken out of the way. (AMP)
The mystery of lawlessness is already at work in the world but is restrained from being revealed at this time. It is the “mainspring of all corruption”, as quoted previously. Who or what is holding back the full forces of evil, giving us time to repent and prepare for the worst to come in the future? The Book of Revelation tells us that more demons will be released as we approach the end. Perhaps the angel(s) who have charge over the bottomless pit are holding this back. That is beyond the scope of this paper.	
II Thes 2:8 And then shall that Wicked be revealed, whom the Lord shall consume with the spirit of his mouth, and shall destroy with the brightness of his coming:	And then the lawless one (the antichrist) will be revealed and the Lord Jesus will slay him with the breath of His mouth and bring him to an end by His appearing at His coming. (AMP) Perhaps is best to leave the details until we study Revelation.
II Thes 2:9 [Even him], whose coming is after the working of Satan with all power and signs and lying wonders, [Yea, the Lord, even Jesus, whose coming is not until after there cometh a falling away, by the working of Satan with all power, and signs and lying wonders, JST]	The coming [of the lawless one, the antichrist] is through the activity and working of Satan and will be attended by great power and with all sorts of [pretended] miracles and signs and delusive marvels--[all of them] lying wonders—(AMP)
II Thes 2:10 And with all deceivableness of unrighteousness in them that perish; because they received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved.	And by unlimited seduction to evil and with all wicked deception for those who are perishing (going to perdition) because they did not welcome the Truth but refused to love it that they might be saved. (AMP)
II Thes 2:11 And for this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie:	Therefore God sends upon them a misleading influence, a working of error and a strong delusion to make them believe what is false, (AMP)
The worst of this is yet to come, but strong delusions are already shrouding the world. Mistrust and distrust are on the rise. It’s getting to the point that nobody knows where to turn for reliable information about anything.	
II Thes 2:12 That they all might be damned who believed not the truth, but had pleasure in unrighteousness.	In order that all may be judged and condemned who did not believe in [who refused to adhere to, trust in, and rely on] the Truth, but [instead] took pleasure in unrighteousness. (AMP)

	There will be an entire separation of the righteous and the wicked. There will be no doubt about who serves the Lord and who doesn't.
II Thes 2:13 But we are bound to give thanks alway to God for you, brethren beloved of the Lord, because God hath from the beginning chosen you to salvation through sanctification of the Spirit and belief of the truth:	<p>But we, brethren beloved by the Lord, ought and are obligated [as those who are in debt] to give thanks always to God for you, because God chose you from the beginning as His firstfruits (first converts) for salvation through the sanctifying work of the [Holy] Spirit and [your] belief in (adherence to, trust in, and reliance on) the Truth. Indeed, we hear that some among you are disorderly [that they are passing their lives in idleness, neglectful of duty], being busy with other people's affairs instead of their own and doing no work.
